ISBD regularises the form and content of bibliographic descriptions. It mainly deals with description of resources and is not directly concerned with access points or authority control since it was created long before the possibilities offered by computerized data processing were understood.

Indeed, one might argue that in the history of cataloguing no other standard has enjoyed such a high degree of acceptance as that accorded to the ISBD concept, which is now nearly universally applied. Published in 1971, the International Standard Bibliographic Description for Monographic Publications (ISBD(M)) was the first of the ISBDs.

Currently, most cataloging codes are similar to, or even based on, the International Standard Bibliographic Description (ISBD), a set of rules produced by the International Federation of Library Associations and Institutions (IFLA) to describe a wide range of library materials.

International Standard Bibliographic Description (ISBD)

ISBD is a standard from IFLA designed to make bibliographic description more consistent across a wide range of applications. It serves two distinct functions: to define the selection and order of data elements to be recorded, and to prescribe punctuation to be used inside a bibliographic description.

It is defined by the International Standard Bibliographic Description rules and the Anglo-American Cataloguing Rules. heading. Another term from card catalog days, "heading" refers to any part of the bibliographic record that would result in a separate card entry in the catalog.
