You may, of course, ask yourself what seeds can you grow into microgreens. Well, I have found that there are several groups of plants. They are as follows: Amaryllidaceae family- onion, garlic, leek. Asteraceae family- lettuce, chicory, endive, radicchio. Apiaceae family- carrot, celery, fennel, dill.

Microgreens have a quick turnaround time, but there are differences in growth rate between different types and varieties. The majority of vegetable varieties grown as microgreens are ready for harvest in about 2 weeks, though the brassicas mustard and radish have a faster growth rate and therefore mature faster than beets, carrots, or chard.

Some General Guidelines: Microgreens in general prefer a soil pH of near 6.0 at germination in their water, soil or hydroponic solution. Most municipal water systems are too high (too acidic) in pH for optimum swelling and shoot strength. See “pH balancing your water” guideline for more.
