The black rhinoceros or hook-lipped rhinoceros is a species of rhinoceros, native to eastern and southern Africa including Botswana, Kenya, Malawi, Mozambique, Namibia, South Africa, Eswatini, Tanzania, Zambia, and Zimbabwe. Although the rhinoceros is referred to as black, its colors vary from brown to grey.

After three decades of Save the Rhino Trust's pioneering efforts and collaboration with the Namibian government and communities, the black rhino population grew steadily in size. The region is now home to the last truly wild population of any rhino species on the planet; the largest to persist outside national parks.

Conserving the desert-adapted black rhino - Travel News ...

The desert-dwelling black rhino (*diceros bicornis occidentalis*) is a small subspecies, which has adapted to survival in the desert and semi-desert conditions of the Kaokoveld in north-west Namibia. Originally distributed in north-western Namibia and southwestern Angola, today this subspecies is restricted to wildlife reserves in Namibia with sporadic sightings in Angola.

Black rhinos have two horns which make them lucrative targets for the illegal trade in rhino horn. A wave of poaching for rhino horn rippled through Kenya and Tanzania, continued south through Zambia's Luangwa Valley as far as the Zambezi River, and spread into Zimbabwe.

Today there are fewer than 5,000 black rhinos left in the wild, and, with poaching sweeping across the continent, the critically endangered black rhinos' last stand may be in north-western Namibia. The black rhino has a front horn that is sometimes as much as 107cm long. It uses this horn to defend itself and to dig. The rear horn may be the same length or shorter. The digging horn is so strong that the animal can easily uproot bushes and small trees with it. Then it feeds on the leaves and twigs. Wildlife Namibia

White Rhino - Namibia

The Namib Desert is home to the last truly wild stronghold of black rhino. Through the work of Save the Rhino Trust (SRT), IRDNC, MET and the local community, the black rhino numbers in the region have more than doubled since 1985. The SRT has the support of the Namibian Government to monitor both the desert-adapted elephant and the rhino.

The current black rhino and white rhino population is estimated to be around 5,000 and 18,000 respectively. 90% of the remaining black and white rhinos are in the Southern African countries of Namibia, Botswana and South Africa.

The black rhino population in Namibia reached a critically low number in the 1980s due to aggressive poaching and a prolonged drought, which caused habitat loss. Save the Rhino Trust was established in 1982 in Namibia's Kunene area, a remote and hard-to-access mountainous desert region.
